

The lighthouse, located at the east end of the channel leading into Presque Isle Bay, was built in 1858 to replace the original wooden beacon destroyed by a sailboat in 1857. The 34-foot

cast iron replacement tower was moved in 1882 and moved again to the present site in 1940.

• Presque Isle Lighthouse Presque Isle State Park

The lighthouse, located on the north shore of Presque Isle State park at Lighthouse Beach, was completed in 1873. The tower is 68 feet tall, access via 72 steps. Before electric bulbs were used,

the keeper climbed to the top of the tower every four hours to refill the oil lamp. The light is now automated and the lighthouse is a private residence for park staff.

Erie Land Lighthouse

The current lighthouse was built in 1867 and is 40 feet tall with 69 steps to the lantern room. The original lighthouse, built in 1818,

one of the first lighthouses on the Great Lakes, had to be demolished because it began to sink. Another lighthouse built in 1857 lasted only 10 year. The current lighthouse is about 200 feet east of the original site.
